CAMP PERRY 2016:

CALIFORNIA GRIZZLIES JUNIORS BREAK MORE NATIONAL RECORDS

Fifty Californians, including 21 juniors from the California Grizzlies team, ventured to the 2016 National Rifle Matches at Camp Perry, Ohio, for two weeks this summer. They competed in a number of individual and team events, firing the AR-15 service rifle. In the first junior team match, the Freedom's Fire, Forrest Greenwood of Ceres and Morgan Owen of Sonora shot a combined score of 979-39X to break the national record of 974-32X which had been set by a Grizzly team in 2013. In the eight years that the Freedom's Fire match has been running, Grizzly teams have won five times.

The following day, the Grizzlies set a new junior record in the six-person National Trophy Team Match with a 2891-82X, surpassing the national record they set in 2012 by eleven points. The team of Greenwood, Justin George, Miles Grove, Andrew Miller, Owen, and

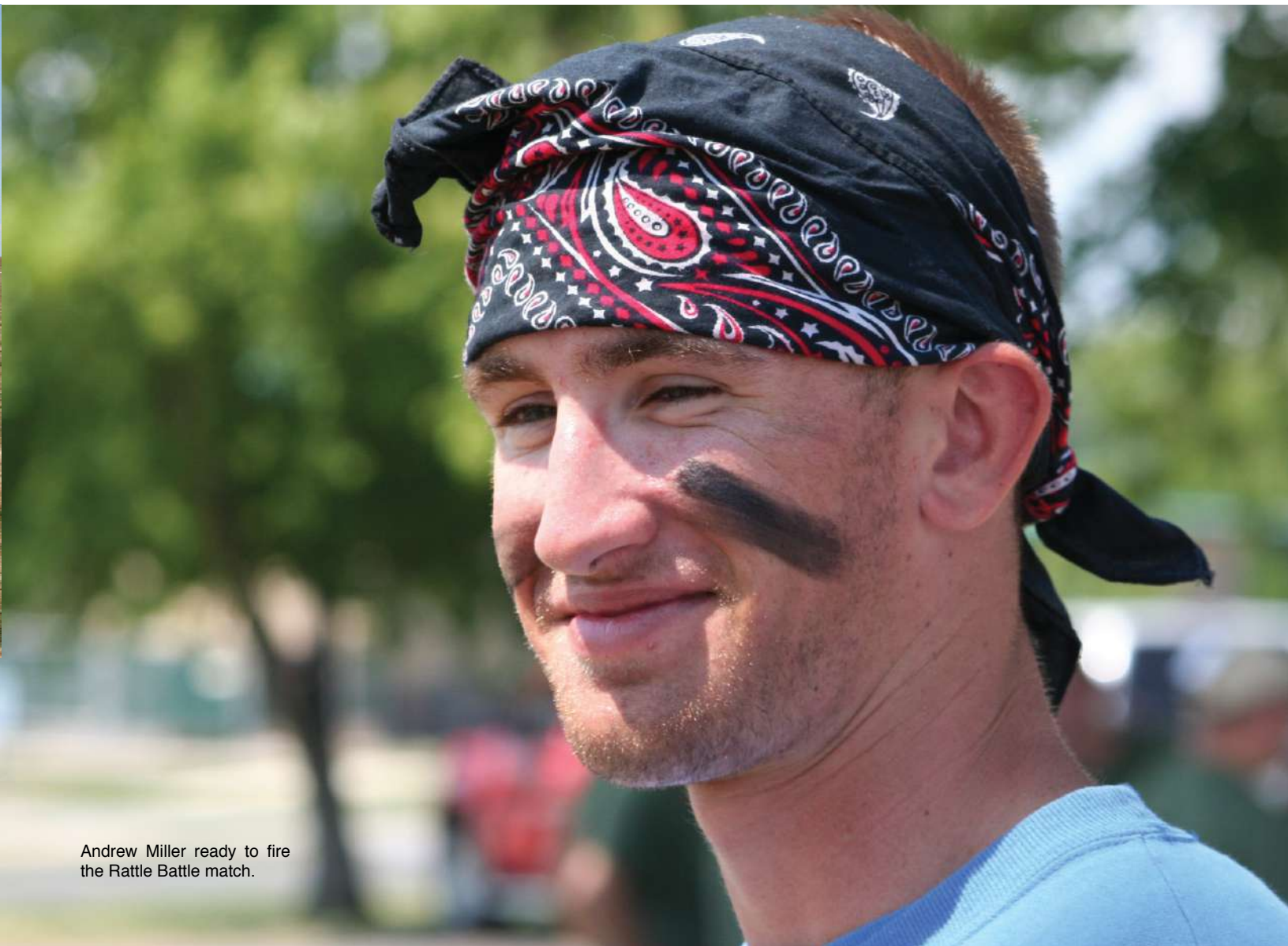
Loet Van Hoven were coached by the Army Marksmanship Unit's PFC Lane Ichord, a former member of the Grizzlies. 2016 was the seventh year that a Grizzly team has won this match in the last nine years and the third time they've set a new record score.

In the National Trophy Infantry Team Match, the California junior teams took both first and second place among

19 junior teams competing. Jim O'Connell and junior Levi Ichord coached Team Greenwood to their win with a score of 1245, which also put them second among all 58 junior and senior civilian teams. The firing members were Greenwood, Grove, Miller, Owen, Van Hoven, and Peter Tidball.

During the CMP awards ceremony, Forrest Greenwood was recognized as a member of the 2016 National Junior Service Rifle Team. This was the fourth time in five years that Greenwood earned this honor. As coach of the winning junior team, Robert Taylor of Sonora becomes the coach of the National Junior Team. He was joined by Helen Grove of Davis as team captain. Greenwood was also recognized as the high scoring junior in the President's Rifle Match. His score of 289-9X beat over 200 other juniors and was 41st among all 1,140 competitors in the President's Match.

After a couple days off, the NRA matches began and Grizzly teams added to their successes. Greenwood, George, Miller, and Owen, firing as California Grizzlies Berger, scored a 1899-46X to place first among junior teams in the

four-person Rumbold match. Third place junior honors went to California Grizzlies White Oak with Joe Blacksmith, Nathaniel Nye, Tidball and Van Hoven. In the two-person Whistler Boy match, George and Grove as Grizzlies Hodgdon, finished in second place, coached by O'Connell. Rachel Babcock and Tidball, Grizzlies Gunzilla, won bronze medals.

After three days of individual matches, Morgan Owen won NRA's High Collegiate Award. Andrew Miller won the High Intermediate Junior Award (ages 15-
