



# LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS

BILL		SUPPORT	STATUS
<b>SB 710</b>	(Anderson, <b>R</b> ) Silencers	This bill aims to end the ban on suppressors in California. By doing so, this bill would make it legal to possess a suppressor so long as the proper federal regulations are followed. Additionally, SB 710 would allow anyone who is legally allowed to possess a suppressor to use it to hunt.	1/9/18 Failed to pass Senate Public Safety Committee. Bill is dead.
<b>AB 1394</b>	(Allen, <b>R</b> ) Firearms: Concealed carry licenses	This bill would remove the good cause requirement for the issuance of a CCW in California. If passed, this would make California a "shall issue" state. This would enable thousands of Californians who are currently prevented from carrying by unconstitutional "good cause" requirements to exercise their constitutional right to self-protection.	1/9/18 Failed to pass Assembly Public Safety Committee. Bill is dead.
<b>AB 986</b>	(Gallagher, <b>R</b> ) Hunting and Sport Fishing Licenses: Sport Fishing License Duration	This bill proposes a reduction in license fees for veterans. It would require a resident or nonresident, 16 years of age or older, upon payment of the fee, to be issued a sport fishing license for the period of 12 consecutive months beginning on the date of issuance.	1/18/18 Passed Assembly Appropriations Committee. Up for vote on the Assembly floor.
<b>AB 1931</b>	(Fong, <b>R</b> ) Firearms: licenses to carry concealed firearms	AB 1931 would authorize the sheriff of a county, or a chief or other head of a police department, to issue a CCW for a period of up to 5 years.	1/24/18 Read first time. May be heard in committee on 2/24/18.
<b>AB 1932</b>	(Fong, <b>R</b> ) Firearms: licenses to carry concealed firearms	This bill will require DOJ to furnish a background check report to a concealed carry permit licensing authority within 60 days of receiving the fingerprints and fees. If passed, this bill will speed up the process of issuing CCWs to law abiding Californians.	1/24/18 Read first time. May be heard in committee on 2/24/18.

<b>SB 459</b>	(Portantino, <b>D</b> ) Firearms: dealer inspections	SB 459 would require DOJ to conduct inspections of firearm dealers at least every 3 years. This will only create more work for an already overburdened DOJ, and create unnecessary red tape for California FFLs.	1/18/18 Passed Senate Appropriations Committee. Up for vote on the Senate floor.
