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MATCH ADMINISTRATION PROCEDURES

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PROCEDURES FOR CONDUCTING A CRPA STATE CHAMPIONSHIP

What We Do:

California Rifle & Pistol Association, Incorporated (“CRPA”) sponsors state matches across the State of California. Our hope is to get more people pulling triggers, provide training, and offer friendly competition in the shooting sports. While ranges across the state host the matches, CRPA sponsors these matches, and provides match awards and pins based upon an approved association budget and need.

1.0 Activity Committee/Host Club/Range Pre-Match State Championship Responsibilities

The process for registering a state championship is defined below:

- 1.1 In order to be named as a host club/range that will hold a CRPA state championship match, CRPA must take into consideration certain requirements for hosting such a prestigious event. CRPA has the sole discretion to determine which clubs/ranges will hold state championships that are supported by CRPA. Once the club is chosen, the club must determine the scheduling of the match, course of fire, entry fees, host club/range profits, CRPA proceeds, jury selection, and the remaining content of the program including compliance with the sanctioning authority’s rules for the discipline and any unique rules regarding safe conduct of the state championship (Per list of sanctioning authorities found in Addendum III). **Note: there must be at least ten competitors participating in a State Championship.** The host club/range can download this “Shooting Sports Match Administration Procedures” (“MAP”) from the CRPA website <https://crpa.org/programs/shooting-programs/competitive-shooting-programs/match-administrative-procedures-map/> for convenience in registering.
- 1.2 The CRPA Shooting Sports & Range Specialist is the sole point-of-contact at the CRPA office and works with clubs and ranges to ensure that a complete state championship application packet (“packet”) is **received nine (9) or more months in advance** of the requested state championship date. CRPA has the sole discretion in identifying the ranges that will host state championship matches. Packets that are not completed by the stated deadline, may not be sanctioned at the discretion of CRPA. The packet is an *application* to host a state championship and is *not* a guarantee of approval to host a CRPA sanctioned state championship match until notified by the CRPA Shooting Sports & Range Specialist.

A complete Pre-Match State Championship Application packet consists of the following:

- 1.2.1 A legibly completed, signed, and dated host club/range pre-match application checklist. *PLEASE NOTE: If the host club/range is hosting multiple disciplines/CRPA state championships, the host range/club must submit one pre-match application checklist per discipline.*
 - 1.2.1.1 Match title indicating that the match is a CRPA California state championship match (Per list of permissible match disciplines found in Addendum II.).
 - 1.2.1.2 A certificate of liability insurance from the host club/range **with California Rifle & Pistol Association, Incorporated** listed as an additional insured on the insurance declaration page, effective on the date(s) of the proposed state championship. Proof of insurance coverage **must be received at the CRPA office no later than ten working days** prior to the proposed state championship date(s), or match sanction may be withdrawn and CRPA will notify the sanctioning authority. *PLEASE NOTE: Awards and/or pins will not be provided until the*

insurance documents are received and deemed to be correct and current. Also note that awards will only be provided for those winning categories as noted in the MAP.

- 1.2.1.3 Third party sanctioning authority match registration paperwork, where CRPA authorization is required, for the proposed state championship *and* a copy of the final version of the proposed match program with the names of the three-person jury (Per Addendum I).
- 1.2.1.4 Name and contact information of person CRPA may contact regarding the information provided in the pre-match, the post-match, and the match program paperwork.
- 1.2.1.5 Indicate the name of the range designee who will be the official match observer. The observer's function is to assist the host club/range in verifying the required CRPA membership eligibility status of all competitors, to verify the number of junior competitors and to sign the completed post-match checklist. This report will become part of the basis for the decision on choosing a host club/range for future championships.
- 1.2.1.6 Name, email, phone number and address of person to whom state championship awards and CRPA participation pins are to be shipped upon receipt of a complete packet and insurance documentation. **Note: there must be at least ten competitors participating in a State Championship.** Where there are regional qualifier matches, regional champions in that discipline should be notified of the state championship match and allowed to participate so long as they meet all the requirements herein and pay for the required entry fees.
- 1.2.1.7 Indicate the number of CRPA participation pins requested for the match participants.
- 1.2.1.8 Indicate the match awards that are requested. Awards will be given for the highest scoring junior, highest scoring woman, and highest scoring senior. Each match will receive one award for the competitor with the overall highest score. *PLEASE NOTE: Non-residents may participate, but a non-resident may not receive the title of California State Champion for the match.*

2.0 CRPA Office Pre-Match State Championship Responsibilities

The CRPA office shall determine timely receipt and completeness of the host club pre-match state championship application packet and take action as follows:

- 2.1 A received application packet that is not complete at least **nine (9) months in advance** of a *requested* State Championship may not be processed at the discretion of CRPA. A complete pre-match application packet is detailed in the previous section of this document.
- 2.2 Upon receipt of a timely and complete pre-match application packet, and upon approval and processing the CRPA office will:
 - 2.2.1 Publish notice of the state championship.
 - 2.2.2 Ship the state championship award, lower level awards, and CRPA participation pins to the designated recipient when proof of host club/range's valid liability insurance is on file at the CRPA office **no later than ten working days** prior to the date(s) of the match.

2.2.3 Provide awards for the host club/range CRPA State Championship match that the host club/range or designee will award to the highest scoring competitor who is the CRPA State Champion (must be a California resident), High Junior, High Senior, High Grand Senior and High Woman competitors. *PLEASE NOTE: Non-residents may participate, but **a non-resident may not receive the title of California State Champion for the match.** Only California residents may receive this title and move on to the higher level of competition.*

2.2.3.1 If team scores are used during the state championship to select a team to attend a national championship, then CRPA will additionally provide one award to the highest scoring team. **There must be at least ten individuals participating in the team match for the match to be a valid state championship** (e.g., three teams with four firing members each would be 12 competitors, and valid).

2.3 Upon a timely and complete receipt of a pre-match application packet, except for proof of liability insurance coverage, the CRPA office will process the packet. The CRPA state championship awards and CRPA participation pins will be withheld until proof of liability insurance coverage is received by the CRPA office. **If such proof of coverage is not received by ten working days prior** to the proposed State Championship, the CRPA office will withdraw CRPA's sanction of the match as a CRPA State Championship and so notify the sanctioning authority, and host club/range.

3.0 Activity Committee/Host Club/Range Post-State Championship Responsibilities

3.1 The host club/range shall submit the post-state championship packet **no later than ten working days after** completion of the state championship. Failure to do so may place host club/range's eligibility for consideration to hold future state championships in jeopardy.

3.2 It is the sole responsibility of the host club/range to submit all match results to the sanctioning match authority.

A complete Post-Match State Championship packet consists of the following:

- 3.2.1 A completed post-match checklist signed by the host club/range-appointed match director or range designee.
- 3.2.2 A legible and complete "CRPA State Championship Competitor Roster and Information Report" form (or a computerized printout displaying identical information may be substituted). *PLEASE NOTE: Full name, address, CRPA membership number and expiration date must be listed, valid, and current for each competitor.*
- 3.2.3 Final results bulletin clearly annotating the junior competitors who entered and competed in the match.
- 3.2.4 All CRPA membership applications and membership fees, with checks made out to "CRPA".
- 3.2.5 The return of unused CRPA participation pins to CRPA.
- 3.2.6 A photo of the winners is *required* and can be sent to bkerz@crpa.org.

- 3.3 It is not required but is highly desirable for the host club/range to submit an article about the state championship for publication in *The Firing Line* magazine after completion of the match. This too may be included in an email to bkerz@crpa.org.

4.0 CRPA Office Post-Match State Championship Responsibilities

The CRPA office shall determine timely receipt and completeness of the post-state championship packet and take action as follows:

- 4.1 If the post-state championship packet is incomplete, it may be returned to the respective host club with deficiencies noted. (CRPA may at its sole discretion choose to contact the host club/range to assist with completion of the packet).
- 4.2 If the post-state championship packet is complete but not timely (i.e., received **more than ten working days after the state championship**), the host club/range's eligibility for consideration to hold future CRPA state championships may be in jeopardy.

STATE CHAMPIONSHIP PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS

CRPA MEMBERSHIP FOR CALIFORNIA RESIDENTS:

Proof of valid and current CRPA membership status is required to participate. CRPA membership is required for California residents to participate in any CRPA state championship. Resident competitors must be a current-dues-paid member and in good standing with the CRPA. Competitors may join the CRPA: 1) At the state championship site by contacting the match director; 2) In advance of the state championship by mailing a completed application with payment to the match director or to the CRPA office in sufficient time for processing (*see attached "CRPA Member Application"*); or 3) By visiting the CRPA website and joining online at <http://www.crpa.org>.

CRPA STATE CHAMPIONSHIP MEMBERSHIP FOR NON-RESIDENTS OF CALIFORNIA:

State Championship Membership is open to any person eligible for individual membership who is not a California resident.

For non-resident competitors desiring *limited* membership - the fee for such CRPA Membership is \$20.00. The term of such membership is the duration of the state championship, not to exceed three consecutive days. A non-resident membership receives no member benefits. Non-resident competitors may join the CRPA on a limited membership by completing the form 1) At the state championship site by contacting the match director; or 2) In advance by mailing a completed Non-Resident Membership Application form with payment to the match director **or** to the CRPA office in sufficient time for processing. (*See attached "Non-Resident Application" form.*)

For non-resident competitors desiring *full* membership - the fee for such CRPA membership is \$55.00. The term of such membership is 12 months. Such members will be entitled to all membership rights of the Association. (*See attached "CRPA Member Application" form - membership prices are subject to change and are set at the discretion of the CRPA Board of Directors.*)

PLEASE NOTE: Non-residents may participate, but a non-resident may not receive the title of California State Champion for the match. Only California residents may receive this title and move on to the higher level of competition.

SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENT AND INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE HOST CLUB/RANGE:

CRPA membership or state championship membership must be verified by match officials prior to the start of the state championship. Competitors are required to show their current CRPA membership card. A competitor who cannot present a current CRPA membership card is required to purchase a CRPA membership before the match commences. Their CRPA number space on the “CRPA State Championship Competitor Roster and Information Report” form is to be noted “NEW MBR.” The payment for each “NEW MBR” and a completed CRPA application form must be attached to the completed competitor roster report. If it is later determined that a membership was valid, the newly-purchased CRPA membership will be processed to extend the existing expiration date accordingly. **Each person listed on the “CRPA State Championship Competitor Roster and Information Report” must be identified with a CRPA member number and expiration date or be noted as “NEW MBR” as detailed above.**

CRPA NATIONAL MATCH TEAMS SELECTION POLICY

National Match Team selection, participation and funding rules and guidelines are as follows:

A. The following paragraph **must** be printed in its entirety in the match program whenever a CRPA state championship includes a CRPA national match team selection.

“Membership on CRPA teams selected for national competition shall be determined by individual and/or team order of finish in the most recent state championship aggregate in that discipline from those competitors who are both a resident of California and a current CRPA member in good standing prior to the beginning of competition. A person accepting a position on a CRPA team agrees to abide by sanctioning authority and CRPA rules and any reasonable instructions from the team captain. Failure to comply may result in forfeiture of funding and debarment from participation in CRPA sanctioned activities for up to five (5) years. Such disciplinary action may be imposed after a hearing by CRPA upon receipt of a written complaint filed by the offended party to the CRPA Secretary.”

B. NOTICE OF ADDITIONAL IMPORTANT RULES AND REGULATIONS: CRPA and each of the selected CRPA national match teams and team members must also comply with all sanctioning authority qualifications, regulations, and rules. CRPA requires that members, including team captain and coach, of any CRPA team must be bona fide residents of California and current CRPA members. CRPA teams permitted to enter the competition concerned by the tournament program conditions must be authorized and accredited by the CRPA for that tournament. If required, authorization shall be signed by CRPA. If specifically allowed by conditions of the program, a non-CRPA member may serve as the coach of a CRPA team but may not be a firing member.

THEREFORE, AND ACCORDINGLY – Each team is required to submit to CRPA a detailed list of all individual eligible team members to the CRPA Office, **at least 30 working days prior to the date** of each team’s participation at any national match. The list will identify (1) The title of the national match team event; (2) The name of the CRPA team that will be entered; (3) The first and last name and complete home address of each person that is authorized and likely to shoot on the team, including their CRPA membership number and expiration date; (4) Identify the prior CRPA state championship event that each team member fired and qualified to become eligible for such team selection; (5) List the first and last name, complete home address, CRPA member number and expiration date for each respective team captain and coach.

C. Any team selected in a CRPA-sanctioned state championship and entered as a state association team in national or other competition shall use “CRPA” or “California Rifle & Pistol Association” in its name when it enters said competition.

D. CRPA national match team support for each shooting discipline is to be an equitable division of available funding as determined and budgeted annually by the CRPA Board of Directors, administered by CRPA staff. The budget basis and distribution of funds for qualified Junior Team Members shall not exceed \$250 (all inclusive) per individual for out of state national championships or \$100 (all inclusive) per individual Junior Team Member for in-state national championships. Junior team members will receive CRPA swag.

E. This policy is to extend to regional matches or international matches if an individual discipline does not hold a National Championship.

F. Upon completion of the national championship, proof of the individual and/or team members who actually participated in the national championship and the team’s compliance with section C, above, shall provide to CRPA, who will confirm the proof and authorize payment by the CRPA per section D, to be made to the individual team members or to the sponsoring organization for the team, per mutual arrangement with the team, coach, and/or sponsoring organization.

MAP CHANGE POLICY

With ever-changing shooting sports disciplines and upon recommendation of CRPA staff, competitive disciplines may be added or removed based upon the popularity and need to sanction new disciplines. Addendum II states the current disciplines. Changes to this Addendum do not require additional board vote. Changes to this MAP may be adopted by a majority vote of the Board of Directors at any duly held meeting, where a quorum is present, if the members of Board of Directors have been given at least 15 days' notice thereof, and the notice has contained a copy of the proposed changes.

MAP Addendum I

Additional Requirements for a CRPA “Special Approved” State Championships

In order to better promote the shooting sports, the CRPA Board of Directors may sanction, at its discretion CRPA State Championships that **are not** sanctioned by other national shooting organizations.

A. CRPA State Championship Pre-Match Application Checklist

1. The CRPA state championship application checklist form shall be completed and submitted to the CRPA Office **a minimum of nine (9) months before** the requested state championship dates.

B. Match Program

1. The match program must list all rules that will be used to govern such state championships unless the rules are published by a CRPA approved sanctioning authority for that shooting discipline. In the latter case the program must specify which published rules will apply. (Note: A combination of: (a) the required list of rules as published in the match program and (b) the CRPA approved sanctioning authority published rules may both be referenced.
2. The match program must contain the following statement: *“The names of the match officials, including a three-person jury, will be posted at the state championship site. In the case of a protest of match results the decision of the named jury will be final.”*

C. CRPA State Championship Post-Match Checklist and Competitor Roster

1. The CRPA State Championship post-match checklist form shall be completed, signed and submitted **within ten working days after the event.**
2. The “CRPA State Championship Competitor Roster and Information Report” form shall be completed to the maximum extent possible.
